On July 7, 2014, the undersigned had a conversation with Kent Stewart, Chairman of the Regulatory Authority ("RA") of Bermuda regarding issues raised in the above referenced dockets initiated by the RA and the Ministry of Education and Economic Development Economic ("MEED") regarding policies and procedures associated with the allocation and assignment of spectrum in Bermuda.

During that conversation I reiterated information contained in the public filings of Bermuda Digital Communications ("BDC") in these dockets and submitted on October 29, 2013 (Spectrum Efficiency and Usage Self-Assessments (SEUSA) in Response to Notice and Information Request: ECA Section 78), November 11, 2014 (Global Spectrum Benchmarking Study Whitepaper prepared by Altman and Vilandrie & Company for Bermuda Digital Communications, Ltd., dated November 8, 2013) and May 16, 2014 (Response to Consultation Document Matter: SC-1695-2014 Comments on MEED Spectrum Policy Consultation).

Specifically, I discussed current and future spectrum use of BDC, technology and infrastructure decisions and current and future services. I also reiterated BDC's public positions regarding spectrum holdings, aggregation, and band plans and usage.

In addition, I discussed confidential matters regarding current and planned operations which information was also included in confidential filings previously submitted to the RA in response to the SEUSA Inquiry.
